In my Bushhouse

Well just back from 30 days in Canada, Alaska and Hawaii then back to reality and 8 degrees when we landed in Sydney at 9:00pm at night. Next day dragging myself around the house unpacking and a quick run down to the Bushhouse. Yes, it was still there☺.

Thanks to Mick for watering while I was away, but it really did not require much as there were a few showers.

Today I spent about an hour there and noted that there were finally some signs of buds coming although it will be a lesser flowering this year. There were new growths on some *Den. speciosum* and surprisingly *Den. tetragonum* of all varieties. I will have to have a look at this genus some more to see about growing and flowering times as this year they have surprised on more than one occasion by flowering and growing.

The *Sarcochilus* and *Dockrillia* have some flowers coming! Two plants of *Dockrillia racemosa* have a couple of inflorescences well under way and *Sarco falcatius*, particularly from North Queensland have started to extend their inflorescences.

Then I noticed some aphids so had to get the hand sprayer and give them a spray of Pirimor®. I will come back tomorrow and go through the place more thoroughly but that seemed to be the only problem.

When I get to see more inflorescences, probably later this month or early in July, I will rearrange plants so the inflorescences get most of the light available.

I will get back to fertilising this weekend as the plants will need some food for this season's flowering.

That's it for the moment, 30 days away is nice but about a week too long. Will have more next month as we start to get ready to the coming show season.

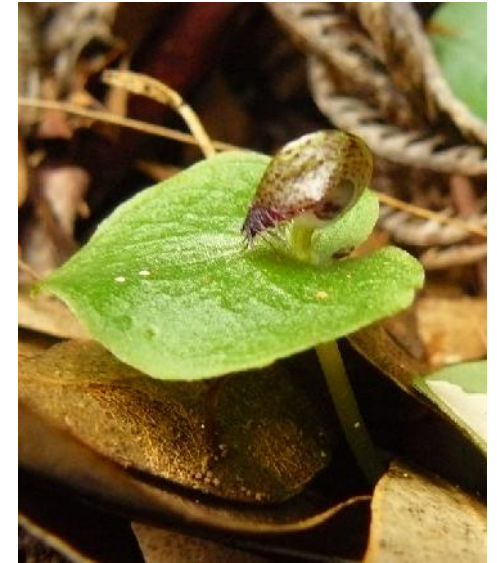
