Dockrillia Granma 'Pure'

Dockrillia Granma 'Pure' was registered in 2004 by the late Brian Gerhard. This is a cross between Dockrillia Tweetie and *Dockrillia* Sylvester.

Dockrillia Sylvester is Jiggi x teretifolia Dockrillia Tweetie is fuliginosa x convoluta

I purchased this plant from Brian in 2006 and it was in an 80mm pot. I transferred it into a 115mm pot in 2007 but the plant sulked until about 3 years when I transferred it into a 140mm net pot along with all my other Dockrillias. It now blooms regularly. I love the clear yellow and the contrasting red labellum.

In My Bushhouse

Winter has finally snuck up on us and now we are back to rainy weather again!

I have finally got round to cleaning up the floor of my bushhouse, including all the *Selaginella* fern, as it is easier to clean up and less chance of insects hiding anywhere. Just have to pickup any loose leaves and get to spent flowers and remove them prior to them going off and possibly getting mouldy and chance of creating any fungal infections.

The rain that we have been getting means that since early February I have not used any fertilizer on my orchids, and this is where the use of slow release fertilizer comes in handy. I have for years used Osmocote Pro Hi K 8 - 9 months 11 - 4.4 - 15.8 + 1.2Mg + TE and this is one of the new generation of slow release that uses tiny prills that have micro pores that slowly releases the fertiliser based of water and temperature and will not dump it all at once. So although we have had the heaviest rain for this period for years the plants are doing OK.

In fact some are doing better than OK and this I attribute to the combination of pots and potting mix I have been using over the last 12-18 months. I started using clay balls when I changed some of my high altitude orchids to water-well pots and decided that it was time to abandon the use of polystyrene balls. So far this has been highly successful not only for the natives but my *Laelia purpurata* and *L. anceps* species which I had been using Orchid Care Services Miscellaneous mix for years.

Some of the plants in flower at the moment are *Cadetia taylori, Bulbophyllum shepherdii, Bulbophyllum schillerianum, Dendrobium prenticei, Liparis reflexa.*

The first 'eyes' on *Dendrobium speciosum* are showing with the *var. capricornicum* usually the first to flower in the wild, usually in May.

the contrasting With flowers and spikes around keep an eye out for pests like mealy bug and aphids and get in first before they build L & B Dobson up into trouble.


