

General Business:

- A roster pertaining to the upcoming Spring Show was passed around the assembled members.
- Schedules for the St. Ives Orchid Fair are available as are those pertaining to our Spring Show. Flyers are also available.
- Regulations regarding the Protected Species Licencing have become more complicated. The ANOS Warringah Group licence covers members, but records need to be kept for all sales etc. Questions were raised as to how these regulations apply to orchid species not naturally occurring in NSW, for example the many varieties of *Den. speciosum* naturally occurring in QLD.

Mick's Rambles:

Mick Korzenowski spoke of the adverse effects of wet/cold weather on speciosum flower development. The interruption points in this flower development were noted.

The Carnarvon Gorge was discussed in terms of its location and ecological value. *Den. speciosum* var. *carnarvonese* was mentioned with particular regard to its olive green pseudobulb coloration which seemed not to vary.

The discussion then shifted to an interesting example of a *Den. speciosum* var. *pedunculatum* which was oddly producing an aerial growth. This growth was a true miniature and a true *pedunculatum*.

A hybrid of *Den. kingianum* and *Den. monophylum*, often referred to as *Den*. Korani was next presented. The flowers of this hybrid may range from purple to white depending on the genetic dominance of the parent plants.

Judges Report: Erik Lielkajis

Plant of the Evening:

Dendrobium Greta Snow – another sterling effort by David Hemmings. This plant is a sibling of one showed several months ago. Seven years old, this plant is grown under 50% shade cloth.

Other Plants of Interest:

Dockrillia Tweetas 'Neville' x Martin Gold – grown by David Hemmings - 1st flowering for this plant.

Dockrillia Waverley Imp x Jungle Juice – a beautiful orchid grown by Martin Davies. *Bulbophyllum schillerianum* – Guy Cantor was the grower of this orchid from the Atherton Tablelands.

Guest Speaker:

Bill Dobson presented a very informative tutorial on different techniques for mounting orchids, with emphasis on the advantages and disadvantages of media applicable to this approach. Practical examples were also presented to fire the imagination of members.

In My Bushhouse

Well September is here and for most native growers this is the time when all the hard work has paid off. The rain that pelted down for a few short days was incredible, but then nothing. Cold mornings but lovely days Except for one night when the wind blew and knocked pots flying.

A lot of my plants flowered 2 weeks early and by the time our Spring show came they were on the way out of show condition. However, when I walk out on to my deck this morning as the sun came, up the smell is intense with honey and the fragrance of the Dendrobium speciosum. Not everyone does or can like this as I have some, few in numbers, walk into our hall and turn around and walk back out. To them it's like a mouthful of chilli, to me It's like a fine red wine just can't get enough.

Flowering in my bushhouse is Dendrobium tetragonum, melaleucaphilum, and capitisyork. Dendrobium adae, and all varieties of Dendrobium speciosum. Plectorrhiza tridentata is starting to release its fragrance which I might say is incredible considering the size of the flower. To top of the weird season I have a plant of Dendrobium fleckeri in flower.

Days are just nice with 20-23 degrees forecast with cloudless skies and the blooms are starting to open and set. Just look after them and stake racemes for transport to your shows and then untie when you put them on the bench.

Look out for aphids and other bugs as the weather warms up they will be about.

Sarcochilus falcatus this year has been strange with some out and gone while others will be another 6-8 weeks. However I love this species and look forward to them openina.

The next huge job even before the Sarcochilus are opening will be repotting and some need to be done now. I will wait another 2 weeks then cut off all 'spikes' and pot on or divide, to get the maximum growing time.

At the beginning of October, November and December I'll be giving all these a dose of Auxinone[®] an Seasol[®] and the rest of the I'll be using Peters Finisher at the rate of 1.5gm/L So there is lots to do in the coming month, good growing.
